INTRODUCTION:

Destination ImagiNation® is an international organization for kindergarten through University students that teaches life skills and expands imaginations through team-based creative problem solving.

The purpose of Destination ImagiNation® is to teach creative problem solving strategies, teamwork and life-long skills. Our goal is to cultivate the creative problem solving process and make it an unconscious part of students' everyday lives. Instant Challenges are designed to teach students how to quickly assess problem components and the steps necessary to resolve short-term issues. Team Challenges build student confidence through commitment to task and group interaction.

The emphasis is on FUN!

TOOLS FOR THE CREATIVE PROBLEM SOLVING PROCESS

These tools for creative problem solving are involved in every detail of the team's unique solution.

Accumulation:

Researching, collecting data and personnel, brainstorming,

Prioritization:

Matching ideas to purpose, inventorying of resources, fitting individual and group goals,

Presentation:

Experimenting, writing, speaking, drawing, acting, playing, painting...

Evaluation:

Does it work? Does it fit the purpose and goals? How does it compare to other solutions? How can it be done differently?

As teams learn to efficiently use the creative problem solving tools, decision making becomes easier, big ideas become possible and the solutions become more creative.

Destination ImagiNation® can open a world of possibilities for students as they apply the steps of creative problem solving to new challenges for the rest of their lives!

DESTINATION IMAGINATION®

Team Challenges:

Team Challenges ask teams to use art, technology, and performance in their solutions. There are 5 competitive Team Challenges, open to all Levels, from which a team can choose. The solution can take from several weeks to several months to develop. Challenge solvers stretch their imaginations and develop task commitment and life-skills valuable in any nation of the world.

The Rising Stars! Challenge is available for students in K – 2nd grades. This is a non-competitive Challenge that introduces students to the Destination ImagiNation® process.

Instant Challenges

Instant Challenges teach students to take what life is handing them moment to moment. These Challenges spark and quickly capture team members' wild imaginations by requiring them to solve a Challenge on the spot. Students practice "Thinking on their feet" using unusual materials and verbal responses to get out of "sticky" situations. With this component, students will learn creativity skills, cooperation and have oodles of FUN!

State and Global Competitions

First, second and third place winners in each Level of each Challenge qualify to participate in the Colorado DI Tournament, April 29, 2006, at the University of Denver. First place and second place winners from the state Tournament will be eligible to compete at the D2K.5 Global Competition:

Challenge A: Back At You!

ALL LEVELS

GYM

Focus: Technical Design and Construction, Innovation and Design Process, Mathematics, Experimentation, Theater Arts, Teamwork

Tides come in and go out, yo-yos and boomerangs come back to you. In nature and by design, things are made to leave and return again. Your Challenge is to create a round trip Delivery Device and Receiver that repeatedly sends balls back and forth. How will your team integrate the balls' many round trips into a Presentation about someone or something that goes away and comes back?



Points of Interest! Teams will:

- o Design and construct a **Delivery Device** that will send tennis and/or ping pong balls from a Departure Zone to an Opening in a Receiver.
- o Design and construct a **Ball Return Device** that will send balls from the Receiver back to the Departure Zone.
- o Integrate the process of sending and returning the balls into a **Story** about someone or something that has gone away and comes back.
- o Create two **Side Trips** and integrate them into the Presentation.
- o **This Challenge can be solved on many levels, with solutions ranging from very simple to very complex.** Your team needs to make choices that combine speed and accuracy for the best results. There is more than one way to score well.

Teams must report to Prep Area 20 minutes before their scheduled competition time!

Time Limit: eight minutes.

Focus: Theater Arts (Playwriting, Set Design and Construction), Physics (Rules of Motion), Technical Design, Innovation and Design Process, Teamwork

- Design and create a **Theatrical Set** that depicts the Setting for your Story
- Create two **Side Trips** and integrate them into the Presentation.
- **This Challenge can be solved on many levels, with solutions ranging from very simple to very complex.**

Teams must report to Prep Area 20 minutes before their scheduled competition time!

- Integrate a randomly-selected **DI**saster into your Safari.
- Establish a **Goal** they hope to achieve on your Safari.
- Integrate a randomly-selected **Symbol** into your Skit.
- **This Challenge can be solved on many levels, with solutions ranging from very simple to very complex.**

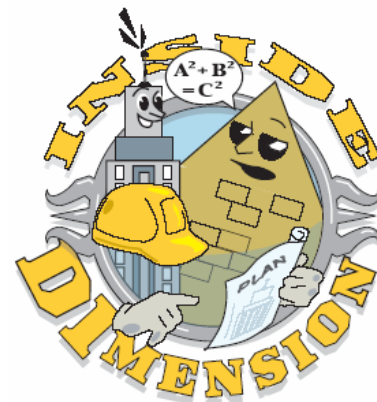

Have you ever imagined the interesting, amusing and unexpected secrets you could find out **if walls could talk**? What things might the walls tell you about people who have lived there? About the Architect of the structure? Your Challenge is to reveal the real inside story about a structure!

Points of Interest! Teams will:

- Design, build and test two **Structures** made completely of Wood and Glue. One Structure will fit inside the other, and the Structures will be tested simultaneously.
- Research one **Architect** of your team's choosing.
- Create a **Story** about the life and times of that Architect as told by an Insider.
- Create a character called the "**Insider**" that represents an Architectural creation designed and built by the chosen Architect, and will tell the Story of the Architect from its unique point of view – 'the inside dimension.'
- Include in the Story one **Life and Times Element** chosen from a list.
- Create two **Side Trips** and integrate them into the Presentation.
- **This Challenge can be solved on many levels, with solutions ranging from very simple to very complex.**

Destination ImagiNation® Awards

Rising Star: For Kindergarten – Second Grade, non-competitive

This award recognizes the courageous, curious and joyous first steps in the journey of life-long learning. Awarded to all Primary team members.

Criteria: This award is given to all Rising Stars! Teams who demonstrate a solution at the Tournament.

Spirit of Discovery and Imagination Award (Spirit of DI Award): For Outstanding Spirit, Teamwork, Volunteerism, and Sportsmanship

Destination ImagiNation, from its very beginning, has been a community. The recipients of this award are the people who go out of their way to help others, making sacrifices not for themselves, but to give something to someone else. We recognize and applaud those members of our community who demonstrate outstanding and extraordinary levels of sportsmanship, volunteerism and spirit, be they Team Members, Team Managers, Officials or other helpful DI friends and volunteers.

Criteria: This award is given in recognition of those who act as superior role models in the areas of spirit, sportsmanship, and volunteerism.

Renaissance Award: For outstanding Design, Engineering, Execution, and Performance

On our journey we sometimes encounter exceptional travelers who entertain and enlighten us along the way. The Renaissance Award recognizes those among us who demonstrate extraordinary amounts of effort and preparation in their solutions or outstanding skill in engineering, design or performance. While the destination is creativity, these fellow travelers make the journey itself memorable.

Criteria: This award is given for outstanding skill in the areas of engineering, design, or performance.

DaVinci: For Outstanding Creativity

The paths we follow on our journeys were once uncharted and unknown – until someone took a bold step in a new direction and paved a way for us to follow. To solve our Challenges, imagination, creativity, originality and courage are required. We honor those individuals and teams who most clearly demonstrate that spirit of adventurous risk in their solutions – those who most creatively traveled to reach truly new and unique destinations. The DaVinci Award is named to honor one of humanity's greatest creative thinkers, Leonardo Da Vinci.

Criteria: This award is given for having a unique approach to a solution, for risk taking, and/or for outstanding creativity (not skill or talent).

*Please note: solutions need not be successful to demonstrate the attributes of creativity and risk taking.
